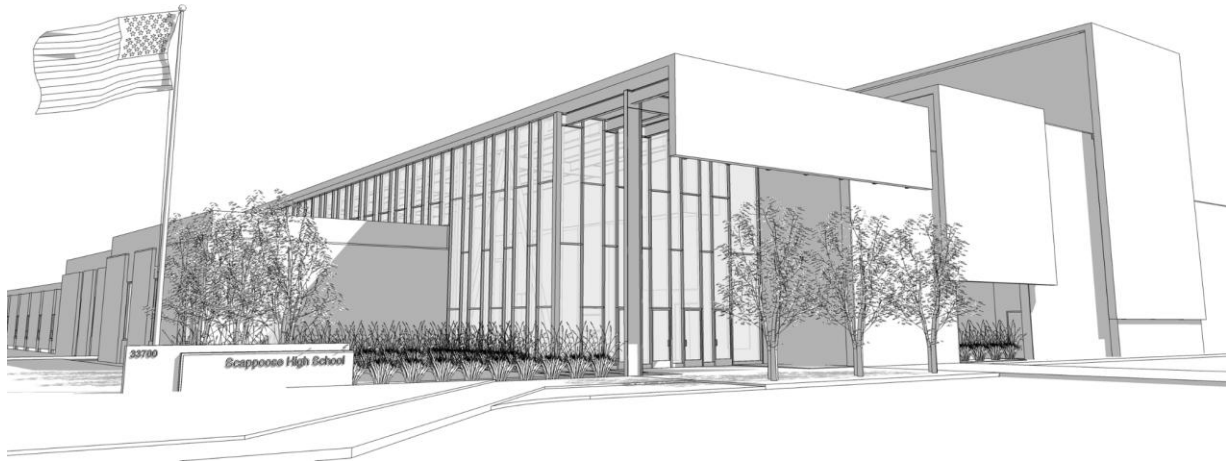

Contemporary World Issues

Teacher: Atkins

This course will allow students to study and explore political, social, and economic issues facing the world community. While the course will focus on current situations and issues, students will also examine historical causes and work to create “real world” solutions. In past offerings, this class has looked at issues such as the humanitarian crisis in Sudan/ Darfur, the Arab/Israeli conflict, China and the global trade issue, genocide, oil and natural resource issues. We will look to the news and current events to help guide our central area of interest. In the course of this class we will study related maps, histories, economies, and cultures to help our understanding. We will also look at some different models of International Relations.

The Films of Robert Zemeckis

Teacher: D. Backus

By request, here's an overview of Robert Zemeckis, the comic genius who gave us Beatlemania ("I Wanna Hold Your Hand"), the ultimate time-travel comedy ("Back to the Future"), a cartoon-film noir ("Who Framed Roger Rabbit?"), as well as other comedy classics such as "Used Cars" "Romancing the Stone" "Death Becomes Her" and the legendary "Forrest Gump." Get ready to laugh!

Relief Printmaking

Teacher: Barron

Learn the process of relief printmaking and create unique limited edition relief prints. Students will explore carving linoleum blocks to produce single color, multicolor, and one off prints known as monoprints. Student artists will be free to explore their own themes and ideas within the medium of printmaking. Prompts and technical exercises available for advanced students wishing to fine tune their artistic abilities.

Fish and Wildlife

Teacher: Byrd

Fish & Wildlife is a course geared for anyone interested in fishing and hunting in the Pacific Northwest. The focus of the course will be on species identification, ethical hunting, public land opportunities, hunting as conservation and the North American Wildlife Model. The course is composed of individualized research assignments based on interest, short hunting and fishing videos, species identification and more!

American Sign Language II & III

Teacher: Darlak

A continuation of ASL I + II class, students will develop increased fluency in their expressive and receptive abilities in finger spelling through in-class practice and viewing of additional

materials. Students will also reinforce their abilities to utilize ASL basic conversational phrases. This course does not meet requirements for Foreign Language credit. Students must first complete the ASL I course to take this class.

Book Club

Teacher: Edge

Bring your love for reading & the ability to share your thoughts & ideas about literature. In this class, you will read books of your choice, share in class discussions, arts & crafts, & Lit Circles. Be prepared to share your insights, make recommendations, & analyze literature!

EMS/CPR

Teacher: Fountain-Miller

This course will give you a chance to explore career opportunities in the EMS field. You'll meet people who have worked in EMS and receive real life examples of what to expect. You will also receive some basic first-aid and CPR training. Course fee: \$12 for CPR/First Aid registration/certification.

NaNoWriMo in May!

NaNoWriMo stands for National Novel Writing Month. Traditionally, NaNoWriMo happens in November, and during that month, the NaNoWriMo organization encourages anyone to create a novel, from start to finish, in one month. It doesn't have to be good- it just has to exist. In this course, we will attempt to write a novel within one MJ term. Embedded in the class structure will be check-ins on progress, inspirational prompts and starters, creating and engaging in an reader's circle, and so on. If you've ever wanted the time and space to write a novel, here's your chance!

Video Production

In this class you will get experience working quality camera equipment and making a variety of productions. We will work on making our news segment, advertisements and creating a film to show off as a formal production of this class. Please join in on the fun of creating stunning videos and being behind the scenes of a true video production studio.

How to Adult

Teacher: Holzworth

Course Description: This course will focus on developing workplace skills and certifications desired by potential employers. We will focus on getting the job, acing the interview, and being a terrific employee. We will build dynamic resumes, refine speaking skills and conduct practice interviews. We will also explore topics focusing on customer service within the restaurant

industry and office environment (common first job experiences). We will acquire knowledge of wait staff best practices, restaurant table etiquette, and food handling safety requirements (Note: We will earn our Food Handlers Card). We will earn our CPR/First Aid Certification with lots of hands-on learning and emergency scenario response practice! Community leaders and business owners will address the class in offering recommendations in support of exploring positive employment opportunities. Course fee: \$12 for CPR/First Aid registration/certification.

Makerspace Stem

Teacher: Lazz

Makerspaces provide hands-on, creative ways to encourage students to design, experiment, build and invent as they deeply engage in science, engineering and tinkering. Explorer Multiple 3D rendering programs and turn your creation into reality with one of our state of the art 3D printers.

Field Sports

Teacher: McNabb and Morrill

Field Sports is for the highly competitive person. This course will feature games like flag football, ultimate frisbee, soccer, and slow-pitch softball. We will also slow it down a bit with a 9 hole frisbee golf course. The goal of this course is to be active, compete, and have some fun in the sun!

Film Appreciation

Students will study the aspects of filmmaking along with critical approaches to evaluating film. The course objective is to help students understand the elements of film (sound, lighting, mise en scene), and to evaluate the success or importance of the film using evaluation tools established in the class. We will be looking at films from the past 30 years, from a variety of genres, that have reached "Classic" status in a short time.

Mousetrap-Powered Cars

Teacher: Pinkstaff

Welcome to Mousetrap Powered Cars! In this project-based class, you will explore concepts learned in Physical Science B: speed, acceleration, forces, and energy. You will apply these concepts by designing and building mousetrap-powered cars. This course can be used to recover credit for Physical Science B, or it can be taken for elective credit.

Foundations of Chess

Teacher: Poster

Chess is the classic game that develops focus, spatial thinking, and strategic application. The class is geared for all levels of chess players. All students will learn chess history, study classic chess scenarios, and will compete daily against other students in a low-stress environment. Beginners will learn basic game rules and opening tactic moves. Intermediate and advanced players will learn notation, sophisticated combinations, tactics, checkmates, strategies, and advanced opening, middle and endgame concepts. No previous knowledge of chess is required. The course is open to all ages.

Improv Comedy

But more importantly, they got their start through improv comedy. The US and the Holocaust

Teacher: Atkins

The US and the Holocaust “It is a fantastic commentary on the inhumanity of our times that for thousands and thousands of people a piece of paper with a stamp on it is the difference between life and death.”Dorothy Thompson, Journalist, 1938 We are going to try for a dive into how the American people grappled with one of the greatest humanitarian crises of the twentieth century, and how this struggle tested the ideals of our democracy. By examining the periods leading up to and during the Holocaust with fresh eyes, we will examine competing myths that Americans either were ignorant of the unspeakable persecution that Jews faced in Europe, or that they looked on with callous indifference. We will look at the roles that eugenics and racism, as well as xenophobia and antisemitism, played during this crisis and throughout American history. In the process the materials will grapple with questions that remain essential to our society today: Is America, truly, as it claims to be, a land of immigrants? Why did we fail to rescue people at the time of their greatest need? How do the continued struggles over how we define our past shape our future as a country?

American History Through Musical Film (Part 1)

Teacher: D. Backus

Did you know a lot of classic musicals have a great deal of real American history baked into them? From the newsboy strikes ("Newsies") to the opening of the West to farmers ("Oklahoma!") to the Roaring 20's ("Thoroughly Modern Millie" "Singin' In the Rain") through the Depression ("Annie") WWII ("Bandstand" "South Pacific") to 50's immigration and urban "renewal"/decay ("West Side Story"), you can learn a lot about America becoming a superpower in the first half of the 20th century. Oh, and music. Lots and lots of music.

Choose Your Own Adventure

Teacher: Bailey

Let's go on an adventure but choose where we want to go. Every day will be a whole new adventure and we will go in all directions each class period. Choosing our own adventure will take us down paths of history, how to's, what if's, why's and much more.

Drawing Bootcamp 2.0

Teacher: Barron

Explore various approaches to the practice and craft of drawing. Students will engage with both traditional and experimental methods of developing the drawn image. Equal attention will be

paid to technical skills and creative interpretation/expression. This course does not require any prior experience with drawing.

Double Vision: Ping Pong & Cribbage

Teacher: Byrd and Poster

The purpose of this course is to introduce students to basic skills and knowledge associated with the game of table tennis. By applying these principles through active participation, students develop the necessary skills and knowledge to pursue the game of table tennis as a lifetime activity. The course will provide students the opportunity to increase their individual level of physical fitness and demonstrate an understanding of the game of table tennis. This class is open to all levels of table tennis players. Participation is required to pass the class.

Greenhouse School

Teacher: Darlak

Greenhouse School is the partnering of Scappoose High School and the Scappoose Bay Watershed Council Native Plant Nursery using the greenhouse on the high school campus. This class is 90% hands-on. Most class periods will be spent OUTSIDE in the nursery and greenhouse learning by DOING plant nursery tasks such as propagation, transplanting and general plant care. We will also be starting a education program partnered with the district to help teach younger students about plants and gardening.

American Sports and Culture

Teacher: DunnWirth

This class will explore cultural changes and social trends through the lens of American sports. Through readings and films, we will consider the historical significance of landmark moments in American sports. We will also consider the influence of iconic athletes like Jackie Robinson, Billie Jean King, and Muhammad Ali.

Culture Club

Teacher: Edge

In this class, we will study the art, religion, food, etc., of different cultures & take trips to see the Portland Art Museum, book stores, etc., culminating in a visit to the Shakespeare Festival in Ashland, Oregon. Students should expect to pay \$250, if there is a hardship, scholarships are available.

Debate

Teacher: Fountain-Miller

In this course you will work on your debate skills. You will decide controversial topics to debate about and develop skills in collecting evidence to support your stance on a topic. We will focus on how to prepare for a debate as well as how to deliver one.

Shakespeare in Cinema (Oregon Shakespeare Festival prep!)

Teacher: Gonzales

In this course, we will be reading bits and pieces of Shakespeare's plays for two reasons: to see how they are translating and re-interpreted for cinema, and to prepare for a trip to the Oregon Shakespeare Festival to see Shakespeare performed live.

Board Games

Teacher: Hedger and R. Backus

Students will develop strategies and tactics and fine tune decision-making skills by playing various board games and puzzles. A few of the games students will play include Ticket to Ride, Catan, Risk, and Monopoly among others.

Conflict Simulation Board Games

Teacher: Kilbourne

Think of Risk on steroids. These games are historical based battles. You command one side and your opponent commands the other. Each take turns moving your army and attacking your opponent. Individual battles are determined by a die roll and how well you've planned the attack. Example games include Waterloo, The Russian Campaign, Afrika Korps. What you can expect to learn while in this class without even trying...geography, history, following specific rules, being organized and strategic planning.

Cornerstone Dog Training (Labrador Retriever)

Teacher: Lazz

Do you love dogs? Do you sometimes wish they would listen to you better? Well this is the course for you. Mr. Lazz will be teaching positive reinforcement training techniques with the aid of Cornerstone Gun Dog Academy (CGA). This course will have live in person dog training sessions daily with a two year old chocolate lab named Hank. We will be outside in M J term for short periods, so bring a coat and a change of shoes. (REQUIRED) Students cannot have allergies to dogs and MUST have a parent's approval with a signed waiver. (REQUIRED)

Backyard Games

Teacher: McNabb and Morrill

Can't wait for summer break where you can spend hours playing games? This course will include classic backyard games such as; cornhole, bocce ball, disc golf, frisbee and possibly croquet. Come prepared to be active, participate in friendly competition and have some fun outside.

Tennis

Teacher: Moorman

In need of some fresh air and a partial PE credit? Join us on the tennis courts for MJ Term. Players of all levels are welcome. Bring a racket, if you have one, or we have some that you may borrow.

Olympic Weight Lifting

Teacher: Nowlin

This class will introduce you to the competitive sport of Olympic Weight Lifting. You will learn to perform the Clean, Split Jerk and Snatch, in addition to numerous auxiliary movements to enhance your development on the main lifts. We will also be focusing on flexibility/mobility as well as core strength. The class will culminate in a mini-competition for all class members. Are you ready to take your lifting to the next level? Then sign up and join us!!!

Ancestry

Teacher: Parsons

Students will explore their family's history through Ancestry.com and develop a better understanding of the forces that shaped their present by exploring the past. Students will research historical events relevant to their family's history, and build a presentation of what they discover. Students will need to know the birth dates of family members born in America before 1940 to access family records through Ancestry.com.

Engineering

Teacher: Fountain-Miller and Pinkstaff

This class is designed for students who are interested in applying mathematics, science, and technology to the real world task of designing structures. This also happens to be the job description of an engineer, so this class is also a useful 'first taste' of engineering for students who are considering engineering as a career option. Students will work in small groups on four projects involved in bridge engineering.

Craft Class

Teacher: Schulte

The craft class is an exploration of making cards, knitting, macrame, drawing, ribbon roses, Cricut projects, and anything else "crafty."

Introduction to Calligraphy

Teacher: So

For students who have never taken Calligraphy. This basic course will introduce you to the art of hand-lettering. We'll learn the basics of using tools such as pencil, brush pen, and dip pens, and we will explore the work of expert calligraphers and create multiple pieces of art from what we learn. Students who would like to work on their handwriting skills are encouraged to take this class. All supplies will be provided.

Beginning Sewing

Teacher: Stout

This course is designed for both new and returning sewing students. New students will be exposed to basic sewing and quilting skills, and learn either knitting or crocheting, and embroidery or cross stitch. Students will work on gaining skills and confidence through teacher guided projects that will culminate in the student choosing a personal project. Example projects to be completed are: cinch sacks, zipper pouches, cord caddies, pot holders, washcloths, pants hems, repairs, wall decorations, and more. Students interested in quilting or particular projects/patterns may need to make their own trip to a fabric/craft shop outside of class to purchase materials.

Cher, Dolly, and Gaga

Some women are such iconic entertainers, they can be identified by a single name. Come check out the history and influence of three women who've dominated pop, rock, soul, country, and dance music over 60 years: the "dark lady" Cher, the country icon Dolly Parton, and the boundary-busting Lady Gaga. We'll look at their work in music, on television, on film, and their influence on pop culture overall, as well as discuss the sexism and prejudice they've all had to overcome.

Collaborative Painting

Don't miss out on this unique experience with friends! Create large scale group paintings with your classmates while you develop your craft of painting. Students will learn how to build and stretch a canvas as well as how to mix and use color successfully. Students will review

foundation principles of painting while exploring themes and topics of their own choosing. Our focus for our group paintings will be on SHS student athletes and images of students from various SHS activities and programs.

Through the study of key dishes and preparation techniques, we will illuminate the unique richness of several food cultures. We will include several food days where the class shares foods related to our studies, with the possibility of a field trip.

Broadcasting

If you answer yes to any of those this is the class for you. I will teach you the basics of sports/podcast broadcasting and you will be using equipment that you would be using in the real world. Join us and have fun exploring the world of broadcasters.

Code Academy

In this MJ-term course, students will work independently through an online course of their choice through CodeHS or CodeAcademy to develop computer science & coding skills. This course is a great way to build skills for SHS's Robotics Club. Students wishing to pursue one of the pay-courses (such as Python) must purchase this course independently.

Projects by CNC Router
Teacher: Kilbourne

A computer numeric control (CNC) router is a tool used to cut wood, plastics and even metals in 3D. During this MJ Term class you will learn how to create objects, create toolpaths and cut out projects using our two Shopbot CNC routers. Using a CNC router is fun, versatile and easy to learn. You can even incorporate the use of the Shopbots in our woodworking classes if you take this course.

Laser/Sublimation Products

Teacher: Lazz

Learn how to make all kinds of heat press transfers and Laser products. Personalize shirts, hats, and coffee mugs. The possibilities are endless.

PE Course (students can ONLY take 1 PE course in J Term)

There are many emotional and mental stresses in teenage life and mindfulness will help prepare students for the challenges of life in a positive way. Mindfulness has been studied in schools and is shown to dramatically improve student's physical and mental well-being. The class will be split into discussions on mindfulness (teacher and student lead), applications of mindfulness (yoga/meditation), and reflection (journaling/goal setting) on mindfulness.
